



CAMPGROUND DOG POLICY

NEW THIS YEAR:

You will be required to register your dog when you check in at the campground. You will be given a collar for your dog that will indicate that your dog has been registered. Registration will include your name, phone number and campsite assignment.

Please understand dogs are never allowed to be loose anywhere in Ft. Tuthill County Park including all campgrounds. **DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH WITH A HUMAN AT THE OTHER END OF THE LEASH AND UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES – NO EXCEPTIONS.** Leaving pets unattended in the campground is prohibited. If your pet is found to be running loose in the campground you will be asked to vacate your campsite with no refund.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANING UP YOUR PET'S WASTE. Please respect the environment and your fellow campers by cleaning up after your pet; failure to do so will result in your removal from the campground.

This policy is being implemented to aid in the adherence to the **NO LOOSE DOG** policy. Each year we experience an increase in loose dogs. Dealing with loose dogs and locating owners of loose dogs is taking a toll on our volunteers and the campground management team. In 2019 many of our volunteers were forced to extend their shifts and miss the music in the amphitheater (which is the main reason we are here) to secure loose dogs and find their owners. The safety and wellbeing of our campers, children and yes, your dog is our utmost concern.

Please adhere to and cooperate with our dog policy. If you feel our policy is too restrictive and you just cannot go along with it, please leave your dog at home. If you are asked to secure your dog, do not argue with our staff or your fellow campers. If things do not go well this year, we will be forced to change our policy and discontinue allowing dogs in the festival campgrounds.
